Format & Process	Length limits: Paper - 2000-3000 words including keywords Formatting: • Single spaced throughout • Times New Roman 12-point font (except for the title which should be Times New Roman 14-point font) • A4 size page formatting • 2.5 cm margins on all sides To put your text into appropriate format please check the Paper Template and the Sample List of References (attached).
Publication & Indexing	Selected conference papers will be considered for publication: • Russian Management Journal (indexed in Web of Science Core Collection, РИНЦ) • Vestnik of St. Petersburg University (indexed in Web of Science RSCI, РИНЦ) All the papers from will be published in the conference proceedings (indexed in РИНЦ) Please note: The paper will be published in conference proceedings or respective journals only if it has been presented at the Conference.
