



SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR DOCTORAL SEMINAR

Deadline for application: May, 20th 2014

Applications are to be sent via e-mail at: doctoralseminar@gsom.pu.ru

IMPORTANT: Please make sure to include APPLICATION FOR DOCTORAL SEMINAR in the subject of your mail. After you send your application you will receive a confirmatory note. If you don't receive the confirmatory note, please resend your application.

Your submission package should include the following documents:

1. Abstract of your PhD research (limited to 1500 words). In addition to it, please include in appendix all the figures and tables (if applicable) and references (mandatory).
2. Curriculum Vitae. Please download specific CV format you are required to follow.

Please note that Doctoral Seminar (October 16th, 2014) and main Conference (October 16th - 17th, 2014) are two separate events. Therefore, should you wish to present your paper at the main Conference you have to submit it according to the Conference Guidelines for Authors and submit your paper through a separate on-line submission procedure, following the link provided under CALL FOR PAPERS.

Selection and registration

The Doctoral Seminar Committee will select up to 20 applicants who will be offered opportunity to present their research. By mid-June 2014 the Doctoral Seminar Coordinators will inform you if your application has been selected. By then you will also be given detailed instructions on how to prepare for the presentation and how to register for Doctoral Seminar.

About Doctoral Seminar

The Doctoral Seminar is a special forum in which Ph.D. students and candidates meet with other doctoral students and internationally renowned researchers in the field of Management and Public Administration to discuss and get feedback on their work-in-progress of the thesis. The seminar Committee will select up to 20 participants who will be required to give short presentations, which will be followed by in-depth discussion with the faculty teams in three groups.

The objectives of the Doctoral Seminar are:

- To receive feedback from the co-chairs
- To initiate networking among researchers
- To help the participants share knowledge and learn from each other
